- 3. **Diligence**: Better expressed as hard work, diligence is a virtue that I believe every individual should strive for early in life. I have a little plaque at my desk that reads: "Every day, I remind myself that my life is based on the labours of people both living and dead and that I must exert myself to give off my best." We are here because of the hard work of others and we must do likewise if we have to give our children a better future. In challenging times,

if we do not strive hard with the little things in life, we would neither be able to afford the good things in life nor the respect we would otherwise have earned. Hard work never hurts anyone so we must continue to strive. In college, we must move about in the right circle of friends where we encourage each other in learning about future career prospects. We can even gain valuable knowledge in our spare time by attending Diplomas or Certificate courses in other academic disciplines.

The other aspect of college life that we must quickly realise is that these years of formation are destined to prepare us for better professional opportunities later in life.
