St.Monica was born at Thagaste in Africa of a Christian family about the year 331 AD. While still young she was married to Patricius and children, one of whom was Augustine. She was unceasing in her prayer to God for his conversion and shed many tears for him. She strengthened her faith by her prayer and was outstanding in virtue, a wonderful example of Christian mother. She died at Ostia in the year 387 (Feast: Aug.27)

St. Augustine was born at Thagaste in Africa in the year 354. As a young man he led an unsettled life both in the philosophy he professed and in his moral behaviour, but later in the year 387, he was converted and received baptism at Milan from the bishop Saint Ambrose. He came back to his own country and the life of an ascetic. Elected Bishop of Hippo, forty-four years he was an exemplary bishop to his flock, teaching his people by his sermons and writings. He died in the year 430 (Feast: Aug.28).

Now these stalwarts of the early Church are real stars for our life of faith.

A certain young man was prepared to be hung in the gallows. He was inquired if he was willing to see his mother before his death. The man refused to see her roaring in his mind. He was asked for the reason for his refusal to see his mother. He said, "When I was a little boy, notorious in my behaviour and attitude, she(his mother) did not correct my movements, did not give enough attention and love to me. She is the sole cause for my notoriety and thus I am now to hanged, why do I need to see such an irresponsible woman before I face the gallows?"

There are numerous young people abandoned by their mothers. In later stage, they become horns and thorns in the society.

It is said Nero and Trojan, two tyrants in the ancient Roam empire, who killed mercilessly thousands of Christians, were brought up uncared by their mothers. For the brutal behaviour of Adolf Hitler the famous dictator and murderer of millions of Jews in the Swastika Germany, lack of love and attention from his mother is said to be a reason. On September 8, we celebrate the nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Her birthday is a great boon to humankind. The little lass who was to mother the Son of God, was chosen by God in a very mighty way.

As she grew up, she understood her role in bringing up the little Jesus in Nazareth. While the Catholics venerate her as the Mother of the whole humankind, they must imitate her virtues not only as a holy virgin but also she is the perfect mother of us all. If so why don't our Christian mothers follow her ways in rearing their children?

A tree is known by its fruits. So also a mother is known by her children.

We venerate the BVM in so many ways. But we hardly pay attention to her virtues.

Monica was a great mother to St.Augustine. She followed him where ever he went trying to get him to the Lord. She unceasingly prayed for him until he accepted the Lord. We can say she was successful in her role as the responsible mother of her children.

Every mother in the world may have one Augustine at home. But if the mothers take constant effort, then they will rejoice over their Augustine after conversion.

Hence let Catholic mothers imitate both St.Monica and the Mother of God bringing up their children.


OUR LADY OF HEALTH, SHIVAJINAGAR



BJP MLA Sticks to His Stand. Lets Campaign for President's Rule in Karnataka - The CSF

Bishop Peter Machado of Belgaum has slammed a remark reportedly made by a pro-Hindu politician, asking people to "to weed out" Christianity from Indian society. Catholics are upset by the comments of Prahlad Remani, said Bishop Machado. The member of the Karnataka legislative house reportedly made the comments while addressing a local celebration marking India's 64th Independence Day on Aug. 15. Angry Christians demonstrated in front of the local government office on Aug. 16 protesting Remani's comments. They demanded an unconditional apology from him. Remani, a member of the Bharatiya Janata Party, reportedly said that when the British left India in 1947 they did two wrong things. They allowed the partition of India for the creation of Pakistan and left the "seeds of Christianity" in the country. These seeds are "being spread systematically" through Christian institutions, he reportedly said. "If these seeds spread, then our nation will be under danger," Remani was quoted as saying, and urged people "to weed out" Christianity from the region.

Bishop Machado said Remani's remarks created "sectarian tension" in the area, which had been "comparatively peaceful" compared to other parts of the state. The laity have made a police complaint to put a stop to such remarks. "Christians are afraid" that now they will face tension, the bishop added. Christian leaders say anti-Christian incidents in the state rose after the BJP government came to power in 2008. Some regions such as Mangalore and Bangalore witnessed a spate of violence in 2008. The remarks are "a threat to social unity and integrity," said Father Faustin Lobo, Karnataka Church spokesperson. He said the comments have "deeply hurt" Christians. Remani has told media that he would continue his campaign against Christianity in the region.

Justice Saldanha Records 1000 Attacks in 2 Years. He Calls for Restoration of Rule of Law

The Hon'ble Mr. V.S. Acharya, Home Minister of Karnataka,

On 26th January 2010, I undertook the painful duty of recording that during the short tenure of under two years of the BJP Government in this State, that 500 attacks on the Christian community had taken place. The State Government is acting in total violation of the Constitutional Mandate which guarantees freedom to practice and propagate one's religion and this hate campaign has official sanction. There are organizations and institutions in this country which are maintaining a careful record of the increase in the number of these attacks in the State of Karnataka, as also of the fact that those involved in them are rarely arrested and even if arrested, the cases are clandestinely withdrawn. The victims are always wrongly arrested and your Government refuses to withdraw those cases and to crown it all, you have officially gone on record stating that all the attackers involved in such serious offences under the IPC are political activists according to you. This is a total aberration.

August 15, 2010 brought the number of such attacks to exactly 1000, an increase of 500 in the last six months. The most sensational one came from your Party MLA – Prahlad Remani who is supposed to be the BJP MLA from Khanapur in Belgaum District. The attack was made by him in the course of his official address at the flag hoisting on Independence Day. I was in Pune attending a Conference on that day and the TV channels have shown his speech live. Among other statements, he has attacked

the Christian community by stating that the British had sown the seeds of Christianity in this country (the man requires to be re-educated because this is factually false) and that Christianity and Christians have to be weeded out and thrown out of this country. This is a serious offence of inciting communal disharmony along with several other allied offences because it immediately provoked violence and tension in the whole District. The State, in such situations is required to register an offence and immediately proceed according to Law. This was not done.

What is most atrocious is that when several complaints were lodged with the Police Authorities and an FIR was registered that instead of upholding the Law, the State Government immediately transferred the SP who had very rightly taken action. This was done by the Chief Minister and the Home Minister. This shows that the Statements made by the MLA are officially supported by the State Government and that the subversion of the Law and the legal process has also come from the Vidhana Soudha. The citizens of this State are protected by the Constitution of this country and therefore, demand from the State Government that action according to Law must follow.

In the course of the last two years, there have been a whole series of cases where the State Government has incited, supported and shielded such communal attacks. The record also shows that the Law has been misused not only against the victims but against the Media whenever such cases have been highlighted and the International Human Rights Commission and the Press Council of India have taken serious note of this. The Central Government and the International Organizations have taken careful note of the fact that the State Govt. spends an average of Rs.50 Crores a day on self publicity in order to ensure that grave incidents of the present type are not reported. All these incidents are representative of a total breakdown of the Rule of Law in this State, it is a matter of deep regret that they have taken place even on a sacred day like August 15th and we demand that the Rule of Law be restored.

Elizabeth would not have uttered the words that she had said of Mary, the Virgin, the Mother of God, had she not filled with the Holy Spirit. In other words, unless you are filled with the Holy Spirit you can not honour the virgin mother of God.

Mary is the mother of Jesus Christ. Jesus Christ is the second person of the most Holy Trinity, 'God the Son.' The Holy Trinity consists of: 'God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit.' Therefore, Jesus Christ is God. Thus Mary is the Mother of God. And God is not only for Roman Catholic or to that matter for Christians alone but for the entire human race.

From the Cross, Jesus Christ, our Lord and God gave his mother Mary to be our mother through his beloved disciple, John. Thus Mary, the mother of God became our mother too. We are entitled to honour the mother of God. And what a privilege we have to call the mother of God as our mother! You can understand and digest it only when you are filled with the Holy Spirit.

It is very sad that the Christians in thousands do not care to honour Mary. Many hate to respect her due to their wrong belief. May the Holy Spirit enlighten them from their ignorance. In 1946, a Hindu woman Rangamma brought a statue of Blessed Virgin Mother from Vailankanni, placed it near the gold mines shaft at Oorgaum, KGF. This drew the by-passing mining workers to pray to the Mother of God. A structure made of mud and stones was made for the statue so as to enable the devotees for prayer. According to a tradition, a British Official damaged the structure and the statue out of contempt. Sooner than he did this he lost his vision. Driven with great fear, he began to change his attitude towards the devotion to the BVM and converted. The merciful Mother of God blessed him with his vision. The news about this event spread like wirld fire and people began to flock to the place and devotion to Our Lady took its humble growth in this remote non-residential place at Oorgaum. What God wants, He lets things happen. Glory to You O Lord!

Our Blessed Virgin Mary is venerated with deep sentiment of love and piety by various names. 'Mother of Mines' is one such cute name given to her by late Fr.S.Arulanandam, a pioneer in spreading the devotion to the Mother of God in KGF referring to the then gold mines of KGF. The Shrine named its name for the GOLD MINES established in most part of KGF a town built by the John Taylor & Company The Mother of Mines Shrine is known all over Karnataka and parts of Tamilnadu

Kolar Gold Mines has the second deepest gold mines (Champion Reefs) in the world This gold extracting enterprise was started by the British in 1880 by the John Taylor & Company. The KGF gold mines produced more than 800 tons of gold since its inception losing its 6000 skilled labors. The century old KGF gold mines unit was closed down in 2001 Feb by the then BJP Govt. Due to this unprecedented closure of the mines thousands of employees suffered untold misery. Today they travel to nearby city of Bangalore for jobs. Companies and factories should employ them without any stint so as to invigorate their lost glory and life. Mother of Mines is their protector and guardian.

Our Blessed Mother of Mines is the patroness of the people of Kolar Gold Fields especially the mining workers. Although the gold mines are closed, today the shrine is an outstanding pilgrim centre attracting thousands of devotees during the annual feast in September on Sunday after the nativity of BVM.

We must learn to endure them cheerfully. Believe in yourself and you will gain in terms of patience, inner strength and will power.
- 7. Do Not Bite Off More Than You Can Chew This maxim needs to be remembered constantly. We often tend to take more responsibilities than we are capable of carrying out. This is done to satisfy our ego. Know your limitations. Why take on additional loads that may create more worries? You cannot gain peace of mind by expanding your external activities. Reduce your material engagements and spend time in prayer, introspection and meditation. This will reduce those thoughts in your mind that make you restless. Uncluttered mind will produce greater peace of mind.
- 8. Meditate Regularly Meditation calms the mind and gets rid of disturbing thoughts. This is the highest state of peace of mind. Try and experience it yourself. If you meditate earnestly for half an hour everyday, your mind will tend to become peaceful during the remaining twenty-three and half-hours. Your mind will not be easily disturbed as it was before. You would benefit by gradually increasing the period of daily meditation. You may think that this will interfere with your daily work. On the contrary, this will increase your efficiency and you will be able to produce better results in less time.
- 9. Never Leave The Mind Vacant An empty mind is the devil's workshop. All evil actions start in the vacant mind. Keep your mind occupied in something positive, something worthwhile. Actively follow a hobby. Do something that holds your interest. You must decide what you value more: money or peace of mind. Your hobby, like social work or religious work, may not always earn you more money, but you will have a sense of fulfillment and achievement. Even when you are resting physically, occupy yourself in healthy reading or mental chanting of God's name.
- 10. Do Not Procrastinate And Never Regret Do not waste time in protracted wondering "Should I or shouldn't I?" Days, weeks, months, and years may be wasted in that futile mental debating. You can never plan enough because you can never anticipate all future happenings. Value your time and do the things that need to be done. It does not matter if you fail the first time. You can learn from your mistakes and succeed the next time. Sitting back and worrying will lead to nothing. Learn from your mistakes, but do not brood over the past. DO NOT REGRET. INDIA: CBCI and the Archdiocese of Delhi welcome the new Apostolic Nuncio to India by Fr. Thomas d'Aquino Sequeira, Dy. Secretary General, CBCI & Director, C.B.C.I. Centre - The Catholic Bishops' Conference of India (CBCI), the apex body of the Catholic Church in India and the Archdiocese of Delhi gave a warm welcome to Most Rev. Salvatore Pennacchio, the new Apostolic Nuncio to India on August 9, 2010 at the Indira Gandhi International Airport, New Delhi.

Along with Mons. Chibuike Onyeaghala, Chargé d'Affaires, a.i. at the Apostolic Nunciature, Mons. Arnaldo and Mons. Ricardo, His Beatitude Moran Mor Baselios Cleemis, Major Archbishop of Trivandrum and Vice-President-I of the CBCI welcomed Most Rev. Salvatore Pennachio on behalf of 164 Catholic Dioceses of India and assured full support and collaboration of the CBCI to the new Nuncio in his new mission as the representative of His Holiness Pope Benedict XVI in India.

INDIA: Belgian nun helps two million domestic workers in India regain dignity and rights by Santosh Digal *In 1985*, *Sister Jeane Devos founded the National Domestic Workers Movement (NDWM)*, an organisation that now has 53 branches in 23 states. Domestic workers are often denied their rights, underpaid and treated like animals. A domestic worker in Tamil Nadu recounts how she was not treated as a human being but thanks to the NDWM, her situation improved. New Delhi (AsiaNews) In India, the National Domestic Workers Movement (NDWM) has been able to improve the conditions of some two million domestic workers, whose rights have been traditionally denied. Founded in 1985 by Sister Jeane Devos, a Belgian nun with the Order of Missionary Sisters of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, the NDWM is affiliated with the Labour Commission of the Bishops' Conference of India.

"We broke a wall of silence, slavery and exploitation," Sr Jeane said. "Our movement has grown and we can change the situation of domestic workers through solidarity, dignity, justice and empowerment."

The NDWM operates 53 branches in 23 Indian states. Its goal is to secure the recognition and protection of domestic workers.

Mgr William D'Souza, archbishop of Patna, said that steps have been taken in the right direction "to create a just society where domestic workers are treated as people with dignity, where their rights are defended, where their contribution to the economy and to development is recognised, where their voice is heard."

At present, the situation for many domestic workers is truly appalling, something that Seetha Lakshmi, a domestic worker in Dindigul (Tamil Nadu), knows all too well. "I was getting 50 rupees a month (US\$ 1.1) and I was never treated like a human being," she said. "I cried every day." "In 1992, I heard about NDWM and so I turned to them. We talked about wages, hours, and days off. When I spoke to my employer about this movement, my situation improved," she said.

Over the years, the NDWM has carved a space for itself in Indian society and has found support among political leaders.

"Women and child domestic workers suffer exploitation and discrimination in various ways and forms," said the former governor of Maharashtra state, Sanayangba Chubatoshi Jamir. "Together with migrant workers, they form the most vulnerable group of people in society who are often denied their basic rights as human beings," he added. Therefore, "it is gratifying to note that NDWM has been lending its voice to the cause of women and child domestic workers."


Thanks to the NDWM, the International Labour Organisation has been developing labour standards for domestic workers. "Great things have happened to domestic workers," Sr Jeane said. "We shall continue to move with faith in God and the Spirit that guides the movement." - www.asianews.it

INDIA: Christians, Muslims and Hindus learn about each other reading the Bible by Santosh Digal, Khristnagar (AsiaNews) A group of Christians, Muslims and Hindus are currently attending a five-day Bible workshop in Khristnagar (West Bengal). This will provide them with an opportunity to know each better. The seminar, which is the initiative of the local diocese, is available every week.

Many kids "are eager to learn about the Bible and know Jesus," said Mgr Joseph Suren Gomes, bishop of Khristnagar. Created six years ago, the Bible workshop usually includes 25 students, Christians, Muslims and Hindus, who are provided an opportunity to look at the broad issues that affect society. Through the inspiration that the Bible offers, they can find a certain unity. Sessions include explanations about the Christian worship, sharing time together, and examining life experiences through Biblical readings with the help of priests, nuns and lay people.

"By experiencing the divine, participants can become 'Christ bearers' to the world," the prelate said. "By freely taking part in the [workshop's] activities, each one of them becomes more conscious of what he or she does."

No formal invitation is issued to participants. "The strategy is simple," Mgr Gomes said. "Everything is done by word of mouth. All those who have already participated and who are impressed by the workshop tell their friends, family and neighbours, inviting them to the next session." The bishop, who sometimes personally runs some of the sessions, insisted on the importance of helping lay people study the Bible, because that helps them spread the Word of God with
